Farms and Barns in Watercolour

Old barns and rural landscapes are an inspiring subject to many artists. In this course, we will be painting rustic country scenes with unique barns in watercolour. Supplies are required. All levels welcome.

(Do Not Include in Catalog) Supplies: (2) ¼ sheets of 140lb cold press watercolour paper (11x15”), board to tape paper to, palette, #6 round brush, #12 round brush or ½” cat’s tongue brush, masking fluid (Winsor & Newton is best), old cloth, transfer/graphite paper (optional), masking tape, water container, WC Paints (Cotman brand watercolours are good for beginners): French Ultramarine Blue/Ultramarine., Burnt Sienna and/or Scarlet, Winsor (green shade), Blue/Thalo Blue/Intense Blue, Raw Sienna, Cobalt Blue (optional). Most supplies can be purchased from the Book Plaza in Burley, Michaels in Twin Falls, or ordered from www.dickblick.com or www.jerrysartarama.com. Paper and masking supplies are available from the instructor.

Watercolour – Gritty and Granulating

Granulating pigments and salt techniques can produce unique textures as well as enhance and alter color, mood, and story line. Join Leslie Redhead in painting an aged and textured building. Learn how to paint multiple techniques utilizing exciting variegated colors alone and in combination with other colors. Supplies required. All levels welcome. There will not be a class on Nov 23.

(Do Not Include in Catalog) Supplies: 100% cotton 140lb cold press watercolour paper (half sheets – 15x22”), board to tape paper to, masking tape, #6 round sable brush, #12 round brush, 1-2” hake brush or cat’s tongue, spray bottle, masking fluid (Winsor and Newton is best), paper towels, pencil, eraser, palette, water container, WC Paints (Cotman brand watercolours are good for beginners): French Ultramarine Blue/Ultramarine Blue, Winsor (green shade), Blue/Thalo Blue/Intense Blue, Burnt Sienna, Cadmium Yellow light/Pale, Permanent Alizarin Crimson/Alizarin Crimson, Permanent Rose, Raw Sienna, Bloodstone and/r Hematite (Daniel Smith), and Daniel Smith Primatek colors (optional), kosher and table salt (optional).
